I was delighted to accept the position of permanent headteacher this week. Breakfast Club

After a successful re-opening of breakfast club to KS1 and KS2 children we are really pleased to announce that we are now in a position to be able to offer places to children in Reception also. Places are limited and if demand exceeds capacity, places will be allocated to working parents and children of key workers in the first instance.

We have also listened to parental feedback and are now extending the drop off time for children attending breakfast club. Children can now attend at any time between 07:45am and 08:30am and can enter breakfast club via 3/4H classroom door. If another child is waiting to enter, please remember to maintain a 2m distance as you enter the building.

If you would like your child to attend breakfast club please book your place in advance via Scopay.

Cold Weather

As we creep further into the depths of winter, please can I remind all parents that children must come to school with both a jumper/cardigan and a coat. Our windows are kept open all day to maintain good ventilation, which means that children must have a jumper or cardigan on to keep warm. We also have playtimes outside, regardless of the weather, so layers and a waterproof coat are essential.

Households awaiting test results

This week, we have had a number of children attending school whilst other members of their household are awaiting test results. It is vital that your whole household isolates if you are waiting for the results of a test. You must not send your child to school until you have received those results. Children can return to school immediately if the result is negative but must complete their period of isolation if the result is positive.
