KEY LEARNING THIS HALF TERM	OUR READING TEXTS	WRITING	MATHS
In history this half term we are finding out about Ancient Greece. The children will discover why this is such an important civilisation and learn about the legacy that the Ancient Greeks left us with. In Science, we are studying forces. In this topic, we will explore what forces are, the difference between mass and weight, investigate air and water resistance and measure forces. In art, the children will be learning a variety of pottery techniques in order to design and make a Greek inspired pot. If you have an old shirt/t-shirt that your child can bring in to cover their uniform, this would be greatly appreciated.	In guided reading this half term, each class is reading a different text. They will be learning to read fluently and with expression. They will focus on answering different style retrieval questions and using what they have read to make inferences about characters feelings. Children will also be using the skill of text mapping to help them to answer questions about what they have read.	In Writing, we are focusing on Ancient Greek myths. We will first read and order the events that occurred in the myth, Medusa. We will then use this and our vast expanse of vocabulary to write our own versions of the myth. Our second unit of writing, will focus on re-writing the myth as a newspaper report by thinking about how this would have been reported in modern times. Our final unit of writing will focus of Greek Gods. We will research, write and publish our own non-chronological reports sharing key facts about them.	In Year 5, will learn the skills to complete multiplicat and division questions. Children will investigate multiples, factors, primes, square numbers and cube numbers. We will also be learning about how to calculate the perimeter and area of rectangles and compound shapes. Year 6 will continue their learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. We will look at how we c multiply and divide fractions, convert fractions to decimals and percentages and find percentages of amounts. We will re-look at multiplying and dividing any number by 10, 100 and 1,000.
